IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Permitting Creditors to Assign Claims for Civil Action Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 32, § 577, amended. Section 577 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 430 of the public laws of 1965, is amended by adding at the end, a new sentence, as follows:

Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent a creditor from personally assigning his own accounts to an individual or corporation, other than a collection agency, for the sole purpose of bringing a civil action thereon.
