IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Weekly Benefits for Total Unemployment Under Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 1191, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 1191 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 8 of chapter 381 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

2. Weekly benefit amount for total unemployment. On and after April 1, 1966 1968, each eligible individual who is totally unemployed in any week shall be paid with respect to such week, benefits equal to $\frac{1}{25}$ 1/22 of his wages, rounded to the nearest highest dollar, earned in the high quarter of his base period, but not less than \$10. The maximum weekly benefit amount for claimants requesting insured status determination from June 1st of a calendar year to May 31st of the next calendar year shall not exceed 50% of the annual average weekly wage, rounded to the nearest highest dollar, paid in the calendar year preceding June 1st of such calendar year. The maximum weekly benefit amount for elaimants requesting insured status determination from April 7, 1966 to May 31, 1966 shall not exceed 50% of the annual average weekly wage, rounded to the nearest dollar, paid in the calendar year from April 7, 1966 to May 31, 1966 shall not exceed 50% of the annual average weekly wage, rounded to the nearest dollar, paid in the calendar year from April 7, 1966 to May 31, 1966 shall not exceed 50% of the annual average weekly wage, rounded to the nearest dollar, paid in the calendar year 1964.
