STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Prohibiting the Use of Dogs for the Hunting of Wild Animals in Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12 § 2462, amended. Section 2462 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

It shall be unlawful to use a dog for the hunting of any wild animal in Lincoln County from $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before sunrise to $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset during the open season on deer. This paragraph shall not apply to training or field trials held in accordance with Title 7, chapter 707.
