## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT Relating to High School Equivalency Certificates.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 20, § 102, sub-§ 14, amended.** Subsection 14 of section 102 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

14. High school equivalency certificates. To issue state high school equivalency certificates to residents of Maine, either war veterans members or former members of the Armed Forces of the United States or to other citizens 21 residents 20 years of age or over, who demonstrate, through procedures prescribed by the commissioner, that they have attained a general educational development comparable to that of secondary school graduates, except that Maine residents at least 18 years of age who have not been in attendance at a public school for one year or more and who have completed a formal training program approved by the commissioner, may become eligible for a certificate. Certificates so issued shall have the legal status of high school diplomas. Fees sufficient to defray operating costs may be charged by the commissioner, except that honorably discharged war veterans or released veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States shall be exempt from payment of fees, which shall be paid from the income of the Permanent School Fund.
