AN ACT Relating to Use of Interest of Organized Townships Fund by Lakeville Plantation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 4166, amended. Section 4166 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 67 of chapter 226 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding at the end thereof, the following paragraph.

The amount due Lakeville Plantation, Penobscot County, annually under this section shall be expended in accordance with this section and any excess shall, under the supervision and direction of the superintending school committee of Lakeville Plantation, be used to establish scholarship aid for students of Lakeville Plantation to receive post high school education.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. The Plantation does not anticipate any other families with school-age children moving into this isolated area.
2. The Wild Lands interest payment more than pays the educational expenses for schooling and boarding its pupil at Lee Academy and for its pro-rated share of the administrative cost for School Union # 110, of which it is a part.
3. If they are unable to use this money for tuition purposes, the funds will accumulate for a school expenditure which no longer exists.

4. If in the future, these funds were needed for paying tuition, travel, etc. for pupils K-12, then this would receive first priority with the Committee.

5. No other funds which may be available to the School Committee will be used for scholarship purposes.

6. Rules and regulations concerning the qualifications of possible recipients will be based on those which may be established by the school accepting the pupil(s).
