STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Exempting Water Sold For Human Consumption from Sales Tax.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 36, § 1760, sub-§ 9-A, additional. Section 1760 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 9-A, as follows:
- 9-A. Water. Water purchased by any individual for use exclusively in his home and upon the land surrounding the same; provided said water shall not be exempt if, without separate metering or separate intake, the premises supplied with water shall be used not only for the home of the purchaser but also for a store, place of business, farm or any other purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

It is estimated that this legislation will result in a loss of revenue to the General Fund of approximately \$175,000 per year.
