STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Aid for Persons Injured in Hunting Accidents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2955, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 2955, to read as follows:

§ 2955. Aid for injured persons

It is unlawful for any person who has inflicted injury to a human being by gunfire, or with a bow and arrow, while hunting or trapping, to flee or to fail or refuse to render immediate and full assistance to the person so injured.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of \$200 and in addition thereto shall be denied the right to hunt or trap anywhere in this State, with or without a license, for a period of 10 years.
