SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 213, L. D. 476, Bill, "An Act

Relating to School Entrance Age Requirements."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th paragraphs (same in L. D. 476) and inserting in place thereof the following:

'In the public schools of the State only those children who are or will become 6 years of age on or before Θ to grade one. September 1st of the school year shall be admitted to grade one.

In schools which offer a one-year-childhood-education-program prior-to-grade-one <u>kindergarten program</u>, only those children who will be 5 years of age on or before October-15th <u>September 1st</u> of the school year shall be admitted;-except-that not-more-than-5-pilot-programs-related-to-school-entrance-age may-be-administered-locally-with-approval-of-the-State-Board-of Education-during-the-1965-66;-1966-67-school-years-only:--Grade one-age-limitations-shall-not-apply-to-children-participating-in those-pilot-programs.

In schools which offer a 2-year-childhood-education-program prior-to-grade-one <u>kindergarten</u> and prekindergarten program, only those children who will be 4 years of age on or before October-15th <u>September 1st</u> of the school year shall be admitted.'
