STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Firearms in Camps Under Fish and Game Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2252-A, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 2252-A, to read as follows:

§ 2252-A. Firearms

No owner, keeper or employee thereof or any other person shall have a firearm in his possession at any time in any camp, camp yard, house or building used partly or wholly in lumbering operations, log driving or construction of any kind. The owner or keeper of such camp, camp yard, house or building may possess a firearm for the protection of property from destruction by wild animals upon obtaining a permit from the game warden in the warden district in which such camp, house or building is located.
