STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Clothing Allowances for Personnel of the Lewiston Police Department.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 7-A, amended. Section 7-A of Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as enacted by chapter 191 of the private and special laws of 1951 and as last amended by chapter 135 of the private and special laws of 1961, is further amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 7-A. Uniforms for members. The city shall supply members of the police department with necessary uniforms, but shall not expend more than \$150 \$200 per member annually. The city shall supply male members of the police department who do not wear uniforms a clothing allowance not to exceed \$150 \$200 per member annually. This section shall apply only to those who have been appointed permanent members of the police department for at least one year.
