STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Overtime for Hotels and Motels Under Minimum Wage Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 664, amended. The last sentence of section 664 of Title 26, of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 5 of chapter 410 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

The overtime provision of this section shall not apply to the canning, processing, preserving, freezing, drying, marketing, storing, packing for shipment or distribution of herring as sardines, of perishable foods, of agricultural produce, and meat and fish products, nor to the canning of perishable goods, nor to nursing homes and hospitals, hotels and motels.
