## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Create an Alternate Member to Serve on the State Probation and Parole Board.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 34, § 1551, amended. The 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th sentences of section 1551 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:

The Commissioner of Mental Health and Corrections shall be ex officio a member of the board except that he may appoint any suitable person from his department to serve during his pleasure, in his absence, as a member of the board, but in no ease longer than his term of office as commissioner; furthermore, there shall be an alternate member of the board, appointed in the same manner as are regularly appointed members of the board. Said alternate member or in the absence of the ex officio member of the board. The term of the alternate member and regularly appointed members of the board shall be 4 years and until their successors have been appointed and qualified, or during the pleasure of the Governor and Council. A vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner in which a regular appointment is made. The alternate member and regularly appointed members of the board shall be paid \$25 per day and necessary expenses for each day actually spent in the work of the board.
