IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Authorize the Town of Winterport to Form a School Administrative District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

School Administrative District for Winterport authorized. Subject to the condition set forth in the 2nd paragraph, the municipality of Winterport is exempted from the limitations provided in the Revised Statutes of 1964, Title 20, section 213, and the State Board of Education is directed to proceed pursuant to sections 214 to 307 to take the necessary action to allow the municipality of Winterport to form a School Administrative District.

The municipality of Winterport is authorized to make application to the State Board of Education pursuant to the Revised Statutes of 1964, Title 20, section 215, for the purpose of forming a single town School Administrative District provided that both School Administrative District #22 and School Administrative District #56 refuse, by vote of the citizens of the respective districts to admit Winterport as a participating municipality.

Nothing contained in this Act shall be construed to limit the number of times that Winterport may make application to the State Board of Education, nor shall the authority heretofore granted to the State Board of Education under this Act be limited to any specified number of times for the board to authorize Winterport to act on the formation of a School Administrative District.
