IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Prohibiting Hunting From or On Public Ways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2457-A, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2457-A, as follows:

§ 2457-A. Hunting from public ways

Whoever, other than a game warden or humane agent in the line of duty, willfully or knowingly hunts any wild bird or wild animal from or upon any public way within the State of Maine shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50. For the purposes of this section a public way shall include any highway, road, street or bridge that is open for travel by the public, whether by grant, condemnation, dedication or prescription and shall include the traveled way, sidewalks and ditches or gutters and in no case shall such area be less than 30 feet on both sides of the center line of such public way.
