STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Revise Minimum Salaries for Teachers, Providing Incentive for Professional Training.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 20, § 1901, amended. The first paragraph of section 1901, including the table, of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 318 of the public laws of 1965, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Each administrative unit operating public schools within the State shall employ only certified teachers and after July 1, 1968 shall pay such teachers, except substitute teachers as defined by the commissioner, the minimum salaries as follows:

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 20, § 1901, amended. The first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 1901 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Notwithstanding other provisions of this section no town shall be required to increase the salary of any teacher more than \$300 \$500 in any one school year.

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
