IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Minimum Wages for Firemen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- **R. S., T. 26, § 663, sub-§ 7, amended.** Subsection 7 of section 663 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 399 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:
- 7. Minimum wage for firemen. Members of municipal fire fighting departments, other than volunteer or call-departments, who are paid salaries or regular wages, are deemed to be employees within the meaning of this section and are covered by this subchapter. Firemen's wages shall be paid by the municipality based upon the average number of hours worked during any one work cycle which is not to exceed 12 weeks in duration. However, 1½ times the hourly rate shall not be paid for all work done over 48 hours under this subsection.
