IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Designating Dresser-Farwell Mountain in Oxford County.

Dresser-Farwell Mountain, designated. Resolved: That the unnamed mountain in the northwest corner of Batchelder's Grant, Oxford County, Maine shall be officially designated as, and henceforth referred to, as Dresser-Farwell Mountain.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Currently there is an unnamed mountain in the northwest corner of Batchelder's Grant, Oxford County.

The Camp Carleton Gun Club, Inc. of Gilead, Maine has requested the name of Dresser-Farwell Mountain as a memorial to 2 conservation pioneers, B. Walter Dresser and Albert Farwell, who spent many years fishing and hunting in this area.

The mountain has an elevation of 1,420' and is located within the White Mountain National Forest. The top is about 1½ miles south of Route 2, about ½ mile west of Wild River and about 4/10 mile east of the state line.

National forest officials have no objection to the naming of this mountain as proposed in this bill and it is not in conflict with any policy.

Notification of the new name should be sent to the Board of Geographic Names, Washington, D. C. for recording. When a reprint of the Gorham, N. H. - Me. Quadrangle dated 1937 is made, the new name Dresser-Farwell Mountain would appear.
