STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Taking Herring by Use of Artificial Lights.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 3856, amended. The first paragraph of section 3856 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended as follows:

It is unlawful for any person to take herring by use or aid of an artificial light of any kind in the coastal waters of this State, except as provided in this section:

- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 3856, sub-§ 3, additional. Section 3856 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new subsection 3, as follows:
- 3. Limitation. This section does not apply to incandescent or electric discharge lamps.
