### **AN ACT Relating to Taking Herring by Use of Artificial Lights.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 3856, amended.** The first paragraph of section 3856 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended as follows:

It is unlawful for any person to take herring by use or aid of an artificial light ~~of any kind~~ in the coastal waters of this State, except as provided in this section:

**Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 3856, sub-§ 3, additional.** Section 3856 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new subsection 3, as follows:

3. **Limitation.** This section does not apply to incandescent or electric discharge lamps.
