STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Increasing the Salaries of Justices and Judges of the Supreme, Superior and District Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 4, § 4, amended. The first sentence of section 4 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 5 of chapter 412 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

The Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall each receive an annual salary of \$18,000 \$25,000, and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall receive an annual salary of \$19,000 \$27,000.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 4, § 102, amended. The first sentence of section 102 of

Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 3 of chapter 513 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

Each of the Justices of the Superior Court shall receive an annual salary of $\frac{1}{7,500}$ \$23,000.

Sec. 3. R. S., T. 4, § 157, amended. The 4th sentence of section 157 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 5 of chapter 513 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

Each judge shall receive an annual salary of \$13,500 \$18,000 and the Chief Judge shall receive an annual salary of \$14,500 \$19,000.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$339,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 and the sum of \$689,000
