# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Quantity of Liquor to be Transported Into State by an Individual.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 1053, sub-§ 1, amended. The first sentence of subsection 1 of section 1053 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

No person shall knowingly transport from place to place in this State any intoxicating liquor with intent to sell the same in this State in violation of law, or with intent that the same shall be so sold by any person, or to aid any person in such sale, and no person shall transport or cause to be transported any spirituous or vinous liquor in this State in a greater quantity than  $\frac{1}{2}$  quarts one quart, unless such liquor was purchased from a state store or the commission.
