AN ACT Relating to Annual Estimates for County Taxes in Penobscot County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 252-A, additional. Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 252-A, to read as follows:

§ 252-A. Annual estimates for county taxes; Penobscot County

In order to assess a county tax, county commissioners, at their regular session on or after the first Tuesday of each January in which the Legislature meets, shall prepare estimates of the sums necessary to defray the expenses which have accrued or may probably accrue for one year from said day, including the building and repairing of jails, courthouses and appurtenances with the debts owed by their counties and like estimates for the succeeding year, and after newspaper notice, written notices of which shall be transmitted by mail to the clerk of each municipality in said county and to each member of the Legislature of said county, hold a public hearing thereon at Bangor in the county on or before the 15th day of January, and the county tax for both said years shall be considered by the Legislature separately at the same session.

Such estimates shall be drawn so as to authorize the appropriation to be made to each department or agency of the county government for each year of the biennium. Such estimates shall provide specific amounts for personal services, contractual services, commodities, capital expenditures and such other necessary expenditures. This paragraph shall apply to Penobscot County only.
