STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Prohibiting the Coloring of Live Rabbits or Fowl.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 1058, amended. Section 1058 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 1058. Coloring or dyeing live animals or birds

It shall be unlawful to sell, offer for sale, give away or display within this State any live animals or live birds of any kind which have been dyed or otherwise artificially colored **or any rabbits or fowl of any kind in any quantity less than 6**. Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50.
