SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 669, L.D. 924, Bill, "An Act  
Relating to Registration of Farm Motor Trucks Having Two or  
Three Axles."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause,  
the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do  
not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the  
Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, a major portion of farm motor trucks used in  
connection with operation of farms will be precluded from  
the following legislation due to the close of the normal harvest  
season before enactment; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to  
prevent possible undue hardship on many Maine citizens; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
safety; now, therefore, '

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the  
preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'
