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**AN ACT to Require Fencing of Unsightly Public Dumps.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 17, § 2802, amended.** Section 2802 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 78 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding at the end, a new sentence, as follows:

**Any open dump not enclosed by a solid fence at least 6 feet in height which is within 2,500 feet of a road designated as a primary route by the Maine State Highway Commission and is visible from such road or within 1,500 feet of a secondary route as designated by the Maine State Highway Commission and is visible from such route or within 2,500 feet of or within an urban area as defined by the Maine State Highway Commission urban compact lines is declared to be a public nuisance.**
