## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Hours of Hunting Game Birds and Operating Power Boats in Merrymeeting Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2461, amended. Section 2461 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by striking out all of the last paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following 2 new paragraphs:

It shall be unlawful to hunt wild birds, including migratory game birds, in, on or over the waters of Merrymeeting Bay as described, from the hours of 12 o'clock noon Eastern Standard Time to  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour before sunrise of the following morning.

No power boat may be operated in Merrymeeting Bay at a speed in excess of 10 miles an hour, except that the speed limit shall be 5 miles an hour in the Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary, west of a line drawn between the black can buoy off Browne's Point and the black can buoy west of the Northern Chop's Point. The speed limit set forth shall not apply east of said aforementioned line and elsewhere within the confines of the buoyed channels.
