AN ACT Relating to Trucking of Livestock.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 7, § 1302-A, additional. Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1302-A, to read as follows:

§ 1302-A. Trucking of livestock

All livestock being transported by motor trucks or trailers must be accompanied by a bill of lading, signed statement of the consignor or bill of sale, giving the name and address of the consignor and name of consignee and place of delivery. A copy of such bill of lading, statement or bill of sale, must be kept on file by the owner of the motor truck or trailer and the consignee for a period of 6 months. Any state police officer, sheriff, deputy sheriff or municipal police officer may inspect the records of the consignee and may stop any motor truck or trailer carrying livestock for the purpose of inspecting a bill of lading, statement or bill of sale.
