STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Rate of Sardine Tax and Use of Moneys Received.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 36, § 4695, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 4695 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

An excise tax of 25e 3c per case, as defined in section 4692, subsections 1 to 3, is levied and imposed upon the privilege of packing sardines.

- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 36, § 4699, repealed and replaced. Section 4699 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- § 4699. Appropriation and use of moneys received

Money received under this chapter by the Treasurer of State shall be appropriated and used for the following purposes:

- 1. Collection and enforcement. For the collection of the tax and enforcement of this chapter;
- 2. Balance of funds. The balance in such amounts as shall be from time to time determined by the Maine Sardine Council:
 - A. For the purpose of maintaining an office with secretarial help to distribute such information about the sardine industry to the packers as the council shall determine is necessary.
