STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Compensation for Appointive Members of the Various Boards and Commissions in City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. VIII, § 14, repealed and replaced. Section 14 of Article VIII of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- Sec. 14. Compensation. The appointive members of the board of finance shall be paid the sum of \$500 per year as full compensation for their services. Payment shall be made in equal monthly installments. The mayor shall not be paid for his services as a member of the board.
- Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XVI, § 7, repealed and replaced. Section 7 of Article XVI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- Sec. 7. Compensation. The appointive members of the departmental boards and commissions, other than the board of finance, shall be paid the sum of \$10 for each board meeting they attend, however the aggregate compensation each receives shall not exceed \$300 per year.

No additional compensation shall be paid for services as a presiding or recording officer. No aldermanic member of such board or commission shall be compensated for his services.

Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 1968.
