STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Exempting Gas for Cooking and Heating in Homes from Sales Tax.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 36, § 1760, sub-§ 9, amended. Subsection 9 of section 1760 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 9. Coal, oil, wood and gas. Coal, oil, wood, gas and all other fuels, except gas and electricity, when bought for cooking and heating in homes, hotels and apartment houses, and other buildings designed both for human habitation and sleeping.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

It is estimated that there will result in General Fund loss of revenue in the amount of \$100,000 for 9 months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 and \$120,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.
