IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

RESOLVE to Permit Philip G. Clark of Winthrop Use of his Out-of-state Credits to Obtain a Retirement Allowance.

Philip G. Clark; use of out-of-state credits. Resolved: That the Maine State Retirement System is directed to permit Philip G. Clark, of Winthrop, to apply for a retirement allowance and in the computation thereof shall include 2 years of out-of-state service together with 29 years of service in Maine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Clark taught at Belvidere School in Lowell, Mass. in 1936 and 1937. Then he moved to Maine and has been teaching in Maine public schools for the past 29 years. He would like to retire this year and is asking for a retirement credit for the 2 years he taught in Massachusetts.
