IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Creating a State Park Wildlife and Conservation Area Along Penobscot River Lying Between Old Town Dam and Howland Dam.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

State Park Wildlife and Conservation Area developed. Those lands in Penobscot County currently undeveloped lying between Route 116 and the Penobscot River on the west and between Route 2 and the Penobscot River on the east, bounded upstream by the Howland Dam and downstream by the Old Town Dam are established as a State Park Wildlife and Conservation Area. The State may acquire title and fee or other interests therein to those portions of his area which after survey are determined to have natural qualities capable of providing recreational facilities, fish and wildlife habitat or deserving of preservation of the scenic or natural characters thereof.

Any funds made available to the State Park & Recreation Commission for park and recreation purposes shall be used to carry out the purposes of this Act.
