STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Minimum Amount of Benefits Under Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 26, § 1191, sub-§ 5, additional. Section 1191 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 5, to read as follows:
- 5. Minimum amount of benefits. On and after April 1, 1967, an individual otherwise eligible for benefits, whether for total or partial unemployment, with respect to any benefit year, shall not be deemed to have exhausted his benefits in any benefit year, until he has received, in benefits, at least 50% of the figure set forth in section 1192, subsection 5, notwithtsanding any other provision in this chapter to the contrary.
