STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Certificate of Competency for Hunting License for Certain Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 12, § 2401, sub-§ 2-A, additional. Section 2401 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new subsection 2-A, to read as follows:
- 2-A. Certificate of competency required for certain minors. On and after September 1, 1968 no hunting license shall be issued to any resident person under 17 years of age unless he presents to the person authorized to issue such a license a certificate of competency. A certificate of competency shall be issued upon the successful completion of a course in hunter safety prescribed by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game, or following the applicant's success in passing an equivalency examination prescribed by the Commissioner. If the applicant fails this equivalency examination, he must graduate from an approved hunter safety course before he may again apply for a hunting license.
