**AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for the Continuing Activities of the Committee
on Aging.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Committee on Aging was reactivated by Private and Special Laws, 1965, chapter 199 and will cease to exist for the remainder of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 unless the following legislation is enacted; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary that the problems of Maine's aging population be further studied in order to solve said problems; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated to the Committee on Aging from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$6,000, the above amount being in addition to previous appropriations. The expenditure breakdown shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
