### AN ACT Relating to Use of Certain Radio Receiving Sets in Motor Vehicles.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 29, § 1365-A, additional.** Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1365-A, to read as follows:

#### § 1365-A. Radio receiving sets

Any person, not a peace officer, who equips a motor vehicle with a radio receiving set, or has in his possession a radio receiving set capable of receiving signals on the frequencies allocated for law enforcement use; or knowingly uses a motor vehicle so equipped; or who in any way knowingly interferes with the transmission of radio messages by the police without having first secured a permit to do so from the person authorized to issue such a permit by the State Police, the sheriff of each county or the local police of the municipality in which such a person resides, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500 or by imprisonment not exceeding 3 months, or by both.
