### **AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Sales to or Permitting Consumption by Minors of Liquor.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 28, § 1061, additional.** Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1061, to read as follows:

**§ 1061. Sales to or permitting consumption by minors**

If a licensee is found guilty by the Administrative Hearing Commissioner of selling liquor to a minor or permitting consumption thereof, his license shall be suspended for 10 to 20 days for the first offense; 15 to 30 days for the 2nd offense; and 20 to 90 days for the 3rd offense. His license shall be permanently revoked for the 4th offense.

If the licensee is found guilty of selling liquor during the period of suspension, such license may be suspended or revoked for one full year.

Whenever an unlawful sale is alleged and delivery proved, it is not necessary to prove payment, but such delivery is sufficient evidence of sale.
