AN ACT Relating to Law Clerks for the Judiciary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 4, § 11, additional. Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 11 to read as follows:

§ 11. Law clerks

The Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall appoint annually 2 persons to act as law research clerks to the Supreme Judicial Court of Maine. Said persons must be members of the Maine bar at the time of their appointment or within 9 months thereafter. No clerk shall serve more than 2 years.

The Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall be responsible for the hiring, removal and assignment of said clerks, and may assign said clerks from time to time to assist the various Justices of the Superior Court.

Said law clerks shall be paid an annual salary of \$7,500.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$10,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 and the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
