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**AN ACT Relating to Retirement Benefits of State Employees at Correctional  
and Mental Institutions and Liquor Inspectors.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ E, additional.** Subsection 4 of section 1121 of of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph E, to read as follows:

**E.** Any member who is the warden, the deputy warden, the business manager, the captain of the guard or a guard of the Maine State Prison; or the superintendent, assistant superintendent or corrections officers of the Reformatory for Men; the superintendent, the assistant superintendent or any employee directly involved with care and custody of inmates of the Boys Training Center or the Reformatory for Women; the chief inspector and inspectors of the State Liquor Commission; the superintendent, the assistant superintendent or a houseparent of Stevens Training Center; or a psychiatric aide in the maximum security section of a state hospital or Pineland Hospital and Training Center, may retire on a service retirement allowance which shall be equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of his average final compensation, at any time after completion of 25 years of service in any of the positions named in this paragraph, regardless of age, or after 10 years of creditable service in some other position, followed by 20 years of service in one or more of the positions named in this paragraph, regardless of age.
