IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Instruction in a Foreign Language in Secondary Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 20, § 102, sub-§ 7, amended. The 3rd sentence of subsection 7 of section 102 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The basic language of instruction in all schools, public and private, shall be the English language, **except that in a secondary school, subject to the approval of the said commissioner, academic courses may be taught in a foreign language to pupils who have acquired basic skills both in that foreign language and in English.**
