AN ACT Relating to Wearing "Blaze Orange" Clothing When Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2468, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 2468 to read as follows:

§ 2468. Blaze orange clothing

Whoever, in that part of the State which is open to deer hunting with firearms, hunts or traps, except when hunting waterfowl from a boat or blind, shall wear fluorescent, "blaze orange" cap and jacket or fluorescent, "blaze orange" cap and vest, which is visible from all sides, and which contains a minimum of 200 square inches of such fluorescent or "blaze orange" material.
