AN ACT Clarifying the Location of Town Line Between China and Winslow.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town line between China and Winslow. The town line between China and Winslow is hereby clarified, confirmed and delineated in the area located southerly of Route 137 and across Mud Pond as follows: With China located on the easterly side of the following described line and Winslow on the westerly side, said line being delineated as follows: Beginning at a point in the southerly end of Mud Pond, this point being N 64°-0', E 4895.5 feet more or less from a stone monument standing just west of the Ridge Road or S 64°-0', W 861.5 feet more or less from a stone monument easterly of Mud Pond, this monument being marked C and W; thence N 26°-0', W 2310 feet more or less; thence N 46°-54', W 944.6 feet more or less; thence N 20°-19', W 800.0 feet more or less; thence N 2°-01', W 584.1 feet more or less to Route 137.

Said portion of the town line between said two towns is further set forth on Plan of Town Line, China, Maine, surveyed May, 1966 and February, 1967 made by E. H. Wood, R. E. and filed in the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds.
