STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Education of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 20, § 1452, amended. Section 1452 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 450 of the public laws of 1965, is amended by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

Any member of the Penobscot or Passamaquoddy Tribes of Indians, residing within the State, over the age of 16, who is not in attendance at any public school and who has not completed grade 12, may enroll in any vocational, avocational, high school diploma or high school equivalency program within the State. Full tuition for such students shall be paid by the State Department of Education.
