AN ACT Clarifying the Offense of Procuring Liquor for Certain Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 1058, repealed and replaced. Section 1058 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 143 of the public laws of 1965, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 1058. Furnishing liquor to certain persons prohibited

Except for religious ceremonies, whoever knowingly procures or aids and abets in procuring liquor for any person who is a minor, a pauper, mentally ill or intoxicated, or whoever knowingly furnishes, gives or delivers liquor to any such person, or whoever knowingly sells liquor to a minor who has attained his 18th birthday or whoever sells liquor to a minor under the age of 18 years shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months.

This section shall not apply to liquor served to a minor in the home in the presence of a parent or guardian.
