STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Relating to Display of Buoy Colors on Boats.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4405, sub-§ 3, amended. Subsection 3 of section 4405 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 216 of the public laws of 1967, is amended by adding at the end, a new sentence, as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a person who fishes for lobsters or crabs may display his buoy colors as stated on his lobster and crab fishing license by mounting a buoy at least 12 inches in length with his color scheme thereon on said boat so that it will be clearly visible from each side.
