COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1302, L.D. 1831, Bill, "An Act to Allocate Moneys for the Administrative Expenses of the State Liquor Commission for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1968 and June 30, 1969."

Amend said Bill, in the Title, by striking out the words "Years Ending June 30, 1968 and June 30, 1969" and inserting in place thereof the words 'Year Ending June 30, 1969'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble.

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 1. Allocation of Liquor Commission Fund. In order to provide for the necessary expenses for operation and administration of the Maine State Liquor Commission, the following amount, or as much as may be necessary, is allocated from the revenues derived from the operations of the commission:

Personal Services	\$2,500

Amounting to \$2,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures from these allocations on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after section 3 the following new sections:

'Sec. 4. R. S., T. 28, §53, amended. The first sentence of section 53 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The salary of the chairman of the commission shall be \$8,500 \$11,000 per year and the salary of each of the other members shall be \$5,625 per year, and in addition each member shall be allowed

his reasonable expense incurred in the performance of his duties.

Sec. 5. Effective date. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 1968.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the emergency clause.
