STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Relating to Housing and Meal Expenses for Legislators.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 3, § 2 amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 2 of Title 3 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall receive an allowance for meals in the amount of ~~\$5~~ **\$7** for each day in attendance at sessions of the Legislature. Each member occupying overnight accommodations away from home immediately preceding or immediately following attendance at daily sessions of the Legislature shall be reimbursed, under procedures governing state employees, for actual housing expenses not to exceed ~~\$7~~ **\$9** per night. **In lieu of the reimbursement for actual housing expenses, each member shall be entitled to actual daily mileage allowances in an amount up to but not exceeding \$9 per day.**
