## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

#### AN ACT Relating to Protection of Black Back Gulls.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2466, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 2466 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The English or European house sparrow, the common crow, the great horned owl, kingfishers, the black back gull, and cormorants or shag, and the European starling are not included among the birds therein protected; nothing herein contained shall be deemed to make it unlawful for the owner or occupant of land to kill hawks or owls when in the act of destroying poultry; and for the purposes of chapters 301 to 335 the partridge, grouse and pheasant, only, shall be considered game birds, and the following, only, shall be considered migratory game birds: Anatidae or waterfowl, including brant, wild ducks, geese and swans; gruidae or cranes, including little brown, sand-hill and whooping cranes; rallidae or rails, including coots, gallinules, and sora and other rails; limicolae or shorebirds, including avocets, curlew, dowitchers, dogwits, knots, oyster catchers, phalaropes, plovers, sandpipers, snipe, stilts, surf birds, turnstones, willet, woodcock and yellowlegs; columbidae or pigeons, including doves and wild pigeons.
