RESOLVE, Designating a Certain Highway in York County as Harold L. Dow Highway.

Designation of a certain highway in York County. Resolved: That in recognition of the outstanding and unselfish service rendered to the Town of Eliot and State of Maine by Harold L. Dow, the section of State Highway 236 beginning at the Route I traffic circle in Kittery, proceeding through a section of the Town of Eliot and ending at the junction of Route 4 in South Berwick be named the Harold L. Dow Highway; and be it further

Resolved: That suitable signs designating said Harold L. Dow Highway be erected, subject to the approval of the State Highway Commission.

Statement of Facts

Mr. Dow served as selectman, assessor and overseer of the poor in the Town of Eliot for more than 30 years. He was a member of the House of Representatives for 3 terms and served on the Committee on Highways. He was instrumental in having Route 236 constructed in its present location rather than proceeding through the center of Eliot, thereby providing new business locations and the site for the present SAD 35, Marshwood High School.
