## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Authorizing Attorney General to Convey Interest of the State in Certain Lands in Cumberland County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary in order that title to the involved lands will be cleared prior to the tourist season in 1969; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolves, 1957, c. 46, amended. Resolved: That chapter 46 of the resolves of 1957 is amended to read as follows:

Authorizing the Attorney General to convey certain land. Resolved: That the Attorney General be, and hereby is, authorized to convey by quitclaim deed the interest of the State in the lands included in the area on the shore of Little Sebago Iake in the County of Cumberland, which lands lie in whole or in part between the ancient low water mark as established by the common law and the present low water mark of said lake, to such persons as shall have on the effective date of this resolve deeds and conveyances of record purporting to convey to them title to such lands.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
